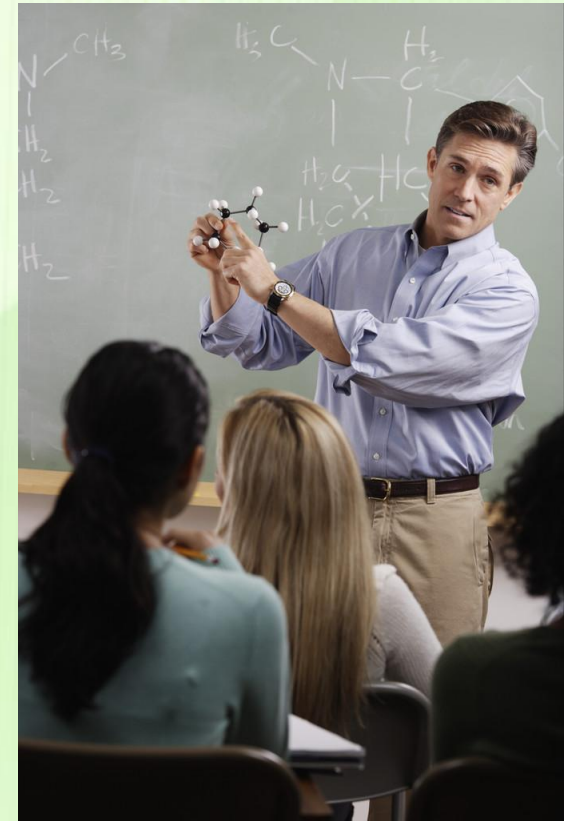


Dual Enrollment Orientation



What is Dual Enrollment?

- Earn high school and college credit
- College class taught on your high school campus during the school day.
- Teacher is certified as a college instructor



Benefits of Dual Enrollment

- The same challenging college curriculum that is offered on Yavapai College Campuses
- Hands on occupational training
- Transfer credits accepted by Arizona's State Universities
- Gain momentum on a college degree or certificate
- Make the high school to college transition less stressful
- Save your money - Dual Enrollment classes are **FREE.**

Who is Eligible?

- Students in public or charter schools
- Voluntary
- Sophomores, Juniors & Seniors
- Recommended by a teacher or counselor



Am I Ready For College?

- Regular Attendance
- Engaged in current classes
- Taking high school coursework seriously
- Come to class prepared
- Meet deadlines
- Prepared for tests, quizzes and projects
- Follow through with all project/assignment requirements
- Organized
- Have scheduled study time
- Are voluntarily making the commitment to start college early.
- Are persistent
- Ability to follow through on complex multi level tasks with limited supervision
- Can communicate needs
- Can juggle multiple responsibilities
- Evidence of using educational resources made available to them
- Ability to advocate for yourself
- Ability to set and meet goals

 - Must use your legal name
 - SS# is required and must be correct
 - Email address is required

A class that must be successfully completed prior to advancing to the higher level course

Placement into: English 100 ENG 101 English 102

GRADES MATTER: Passing = C or better

Registration

- Your high school instructor or counselor will help you register
- Teachers provide you with the CRN
- Dual Enrollment classes can not be found searching the schedule
- You must register by the registration deadlines EACH semester

AP vs. Dual Enrollment

Which program is right for you?

- Both programs put you on the path to earning credits towards a college degree while in high school.
- Your selection should be based on your:
 - ✓ academic history
 - ✓ educational goals
 - ✓ career goals

Difference between AP and Dual Enrollment

AP Classes

- Take AP standardized final exam
- Pay for the AP exam
- Required scores are needed to be awarded credit- can vary at each institution
- aztransfer.com Exam Equivalency

Dual Enrollment

- College credit is earned with a C or higher
- aztransfer.com Course Equivalency
